
### SUMMARY

### Introduction

On March 13, 2019 **Pacoima Beautiful** hosted an informational community meeting to solicit input into the Upper LA River & Tributaries (ULART) Revitalization Plan. The role of Pacoima Beautiful is to conduct community outreach for this planning effort. Prior to the meeting Pacoima Beautiful used a variety of communication methods to promote the meeting. Approximately 80 community members attended the meeting.

### Station 4: Storytelling

Community members were asked to share a memorable experience along/in the river. Below is a summary of key ideas taken from the videos that were recorded and stories that were written on the comment cards.

**Cruz** - "Hi, what I would like to see in the LA river is the representation for the Indigenous people of California. The Fernandeno Tataviam Band of Mission Indians still live in the area, they could make villages like they had before, it would be really nice if the community of LA would make areas like that near the water. To share their traditions and history. Also, a lot of the community here likes riding horses and enjoying nature. Because there are some communities here that are from Mexico who still enjoy being out in nature."




**Marlene** - "Some things that I would like to see along the LA river are spaces for us to run walk and have some outdoor time. There are studies that show that it's important to be outside, they show it's beneficial to our mental health. Having more spaces that are safe to walk with our families. Here in San Fernando I haven't had much space to walk outside and I feel that's affecting my physical and mental health."


**Alex** - "The Pacoima Wash? It's nothing really special. It's just a bunch of concrete, no one really walks by there. I would like to see a path to walk along the Pacoima Wash, I know they already made a walking path along San Fernando road so it would be nice to have one along the Pacoima Wash"

**Julio (student)** - "Yeah more of a vision. I've read the book *Indigenous People's History of the United States*, so I've learned about the land and the history of the people on the land but a much smaller population. A vision I have for the river is for this process to be very inclusive of the indigenous people who use to live here and still live here. So, including them a lot more in these conversations and making it a point to reach out to these communities of indigenous people. Something I see is going to happen is that

homeless people may come up to the river and start living near the river, I would like the police to stop policing them. I would like for them to be ok and have services provided for them. Personally, what I would like to be doing near the river is walking by it and looking at the wild life"




**Victor S. (student)** - "I live near the Pacoima Wash. What I want to see are plants and trees. Me personally, I like taking hikes and looking at all the wildlife around me. What I like is learning how the native people that used to live here used the herbs and plants to their advantage. Providing and having more wildlife near the Pacoima Wash would help kids like me learn about the plants. I feel like knowing about the plants connects us to nature. You have a totally new respect for nature when you know about nature."




**Fidel V.-** "What I would like to see is for the river to be cleaned and become beautiful with trees and plants, so we could get fresh oxygen. And for there to be walking paths with plants and trees so people can breathe fresh air while they walk along the river.

**Rosalina C.** - "I would like to see more parks, more green trees, and for the river to be safer so we could have picknicks."

**Johnny (student)** – "My only story is, during an internship I was around the LA river a lot and I noticed a lot of birds around the area but, not a lot of water which was upsetting. I was a lot of people fishing which like kind of fun."



**Yesenia C.** – "Hello my name is Yesenia C. and I work for Pacoima Beautiful I'm a youth organizer and I work with youth around the North East San Fernando Valley. One of the very important things I see around the community that we need is more green spaces. Adding a green way along the Pacoima Wash would be an excellent addition to the community. We don't have a lot of parks or green spaces so it's very important for kids to have access to the outdoors and the Pacoima wash would be a great way to start."



**Amparo M.**: "I'm really happy with this program you have for the community to protect the natural environment, I would like to see greener parks so we could breathe fresher air free of contaminants."

**Cerina, Crystal, Andrew, Daniel, Jon (students)** – "Our goal is to solve air pollution. Planting trees around the community. We need the trees to stop the air pollution from factories that cause people to have asthma."
